Speed Limit Reduction – Route 174 (resident request): Marlesha Minet is requesting a letter of support from the Town Board regarding a speed limit reduction on Route 174. Marlesha and other residents have signed a petition for NYS DOT to conduct a traffic study on Route 174 starting at Route 20 and continuing to the current 40mph sign approximately 1.5 miles south of the Route 20 intersection. There is a rise south of Schuyler Road that creates a blind hill that has the potential to cause a serious accident. The Town Board Members have concerns that a reduction of the speed limit may reroute traffic to surrounding roads that will have a negative impact and are asking NYS DOT while conducting their study to take that into consideration. A letter of support will be presented at the July 16, 2025, Workshop meeting for Town Board approval.

AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") dated as of this Trday of Jonus, 1999; by and between NINE MILE CREEK, L.P., a Redevelopment Company formed as a Limited Partnership under the Laws of the State of New York, with a principal place of business at 6320 Fly Road, East Syracuse, New York, (the "Company") and the governing body of the VILLAGE OF MARCELLUS, (the "Village") and the TOWN OF MARCELLUS (the "Town").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Company, the Village and the Town desire that a Low Income Senior Citizen Housing Project be undertaken for the purposes of and pursuant to Article 5 of the Private Housing Finance Law of the State of New York, (the "Law"); and

- A The Company is to construct and operate 24 units of senior citizen housing (the "Apartments") to be erected on certain real property located on Property at Northeast of Chrisler Street, in the Village of Marcellus, New York, as more specifically described on EXHIBIT A (the "Land", the Land and Apartments being sometimes hereafter referred to as the "Project"), to be financed through funds from Rural Development, NYS Housing Trust Fund and the sale of Low Income Tax Credits.
- B. The Land is identified by the Assessor for the Town as part of parcel #004-02-12.0, ("Tax Parcel") and is assessed at the time of its acquisition by the Company at a value of "Land Value Assessment").
- C. Section 125 of the Law authorizes the Village and the Town, by contract, to agree with the Company to exempt from local and municipal taxes, including special taxes other than assessments for local improvements, all or part of the value of the property included in the Project to the extent that such value represents an increase over the Land Value Assessment.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

Section 1: Grant of Exemption

(a) The Village and Town agree to and hereby do, to the extent provided herein, exempt from all local and municipal taxes, and from such taxes as may be levied by or on behalf of any taxing jurisdiction as defined in Subdivision 1(d) of Section 125 of the Law, the value of the Project which represents an increase over the Land Value Assessment, other than assessments for local improvements. The Company shall pay all sums due on the Land Value Assessment multiplied by the annual tax rates established for each Municipality ("Land Taxes"). Such annual payments as made under this Section 1(b) shall be made at the same time the Annual PILOT Payments are made pursuant to Section 5 herein.

Section 2: Duration of Exemption

The exemption granted in Section 1 shall remain in effect during the term of this Agreement.

Section 3: Term of Agreement

The term of this agreement shall commence on the date of the acquisition of the Land by the and shall remain in effect for so long as the project is limited to tenants with incomes not exceeding the Tax Credit eligible incomes (60% of the median income for the area), not to exceed forty (40) years, unless terminated earlier as a result of an Event of Default as provided in Section 8.

Section 4: Special Assessments

The Exemption Statute does not entitle the owner of the Land and Aparments to an exemption from the obligation to pay assessments for local improvements (as that term would be construed under said statute). The Company, therefore, specifically agrees to pay all assessments for local improvements assessed and/or levied against the Land and Apartments by the Municipalities, provided such assessments for local improvements are not determined to be taxes levied by a defined taxing jurisdiction.

Section 5: Annual PILOT Payments

The Company will make Annual PILOT Payments for calendar years 1999 through 2040 as follows:

(1) for calendar year 1999 the parties hereto acknowledge that all Land Taxes will be paid to the Municipalities and that no further tax payments will be required; (2) upon completion of construction but prior to the project being fully rented, a payment of \$400 per rented unit will be paid for each occupied unit after which for each calendar year 2000 through 2004, the Company shall make Annual PILOT Payments equal to \$400.00 per apartment unit, for or a total of \$9,600.00 per year. For calendar years 2015 through 2009 the annual payment will be \$440.00 per unit, for a total of \$10,560.00. For calendar years 2016 through 2014 the annual payment will be \$484.00 per unit for a total of \$11,616.00. For calendar years 2015 through 2019 the annual payment will be \$532.00 per unit for a total of \$12,768.00. For calendar years 2020 through 2024 the annual payment will be \$535.00 per unit for a total of \$14,040.00. The terms of the PILOT will be renegotiated during 2024 for implementation during 2025 and the balance of the exemption period. Such taxes as are affected by the Tax Abatement Agreement include taxes levied by the Village, the Town, the County and the School District; but specifically exclude special district taxes.

Payment for such Annual PILOT Payments shall be made to the Village on or before April 1 of the next succeeding calendar year.

All Annual PILOT Payments shall be adjusted as provided in Section 1(b) herein.

Section 6: Method of Payment

All Annual PILOT Payments for years 1999 through 2040 shall be paid by cash or check to the Village for distribution among the Municipalities. The Village shall provide a receipt to the Company for any cash payment. This acknowledges that the payments to be made by the Company hereunder for years 1999 through 2040 shall be distributed to the Municipalities in accordance with an agreement to be entered into by and among the Municipalities.

Section 7: Termination

This Agreement and the exemption granted hereunder shall terminate upon an event of default as provided herein and/or the rents are no longer restricted by the Tax Credit Program or the Company is no longer a redevelopment company as defined under Article 5 of the Private Housing Finance Law.

Section 8: Default

The occurrence of any of the following conditions shall constitute an event of default ("Event of Default"), as that term is used herein:

(a) The Company's failure to pay in full any payment due under this Agreement within sixty (60) days of receipt of a written notice from the Municipality, as defined herein indicating the amount that is past due.

(b) The Company's failure to comply with, or perform according to any provision of this Agreement, if such failure continues in whole or in part for more than sixty (60) days after the date written notice of such failure is required by the Company from the Municipality.

Section 9: Default Remedies

Any Municipality, against which the Company has defaulted, may exercise any and all rights or remedies permitted by law. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, and in addition to all other rights and remedies, the Municipality shall also have the following specific rights and remedies upon an Event of Default.

To terminate this Agreement and or the exemption granted hereunder sixty (60) days from the date of the Company's receipt of the Notice of Default, provided, however, the Company shall have such time to cure any default.

Section 10: Rental Payments

For the period 1999 through 2040, the rental charged for apartments in the Project shall not exceed the maximum amounts allowed by the Low income Tax Credit Program.

Section 11: Representation and Warranties of the Company

The Company represents and warrants that:

- (a) It is a duly organized and existing redevelopment company created and operated in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 of the Private Housing Finance Law and other laws of the State of New York;
- (b) It has full power and authority to execute and deliver this Agreement and to perform its obligations hereunder;
- (c) This Agreement constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation of the Company enforceable in accordance with its terms;
- (d) To the best knowledge of the Company, the execution and delivery of this Agreement does not, and the performance of this Agreement will not, violate any law, regulation, ordinance, judicial order, judicial decree, or any agreement, indenture, note, or other instrument to which it is a party.
- (e) To the best knowledge of the Company there is no claim, action, arbitration, or administrative proceeding pending, threatened against, or involving the Company which, if adversely determined, would question the validity of this Agreement or would have a material adverse effect on the financial condition of the Company.

Section 12: Joint and Several Representations of the Village and the Town

The Municipalities (Village) and (Town) represent and warrant as follows:

- (a) That the Municipality has the full power and authority to execute and deliver this Agreement and to perform obligations hereunder and the governing body of each Municipality has by necessary and appropriate resolutions, authorized the execution and delivery of this Agreement by the officer or representative so executing the same.
- (b) This Agreement constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation of each Municipality enforceable in accordance with its terms.

Section 13: Assignment

The Company shall not assign, transfer or otherwise dispose of this Agreement or any right, title or interest therein, without the previous written consent of the Affected Municipalities, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

Mayor Clark opened the regular meeting at 7:02pm following a public hearing held regarding Local Law #3 of 2024 and a public hearing regarding a proposed sewer rate increase.

LOCAL LAW #3

OF 2024:

Trustee Manahan made a made a motion to adopt Local Law #3 of 2024, amending Chapter 188 of the Village Code to add Article II entitled "Short Term Rentals". The motion was seconded by Trustee Curtin. Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted aye and the motion carried.

RESOLUTION-SEWER RATE

INCREASE:

Trustee Curtin made a motion to approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Village of Marcellus hereto duly convened a public hearing on December 23, 2024 for the purpose of considering an increase of the sewer rates in the Village of Marcellus, notice of which was duly published in the official newspaper of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the increase is required as a result of increased costs in the transportation and treatment of and the operation and maintenance of the Village Sewer System, as well as increased costs resulting from directives issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation ("DEC"); and

WHEREAS, after conducting the public hearing and receiving input from the public, as well as considering information provided by the Village Treasurer and Village Engineers, the Village Board determines that increases are necessary to fund the anticipated future costs of providing sewer services;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the rates for Sewer charges commencing January 1, 2025 are as defined in updated Document G of the Village of Marcellus Code Book, from \$100.00 for 5,000 gals/unit to \$105.00 for 5,000 gals/unit, and a 2% increase of the additional charges to customers who exceed the base charge.

Since the Village bills in arrears, this new increase will not become evident until the April 1, 2025 billing.

The motion was seconded by Trustee Manahan. Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion on the matter. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted aye and the motion carried.

CONSENT AGENDA:

The Village Clerk submitted the minutes of the regular Board meeting for the month of November 2024. The bills on Abstract Sheet #007 for General Fund in the amount of \$48,547.39, Water Fund in the amount of \$0.00, Sewer Fund in the amount of \$25,636.26, Capital Funds in the amount of \$2,375.00, and Trust & Agency in the amounts of \$8,270.64

were audited. The bills totaled \$84,829.29. The Board tabled the Police Report for the month of November 2024 from Police Chief Bernie Podsiedlik. The Building Inspectors report for the month of November 2024 was received by the Board from Code Official Paul Stacey. The Board acknowledged receipt of the minutes of the Town Board meetings for November 2024 and tabled the financial statements for August, September, October and November 2024. Trustee Manahan made a motion to approve the consent agenda. The motion was seconded by Trustee Curtin. Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion on the consent agenda. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted aye and the motion carried.

RESOLUTION- REFUSE RATE

INCREASE:

Trustee Curtin made a motion to approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Marcellus, New York has not raised refuse rates since 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Marcellus has determined that it is now necessary to increase refuse rates; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Village of Marcellus Board of Trustees will increase refuse rates from \$50.00 to \$55.00 per quarter, effective January 1, 2025.

The motion was seconded by Trustee Manahan. Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion on the matter. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted aye and the motion carried.

VILLAGE IMPROVEMENT

PLAN:

Trustee Manahan made a motion to continue the Village Infrastructure Program, an agreement whereby the County provides financial assistance to the Village for the construction and maintenance of public improvements, and to complete the Application for Financial Assistance provided to the Village by the County of Onondaga and to submit such application. The motion was seconded by Trustee Curtin. Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion on the matter. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted aye and the motion carried.

ONONDAGA COUNTY ANNUAL MAINTENANCE

PERMIT:

Trustee Curtin made a motion to authorize the Mayor to complete and sign the appropriate forms in order to acquire the annual maintenance permit with the Onondaga County DOT, which allows the Village to perform routine maintenance and emergency repairs on existing County owned facilities located in the Highway right-of-way. The motion was seconded by Trustee Manahan. Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion on the matter. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted aye and the motion carried.

PILOT AGREEMENT- NINE

MILE L.P.:

Trustee Manahan made a motion to approve the Intermunicipal Agreement regarding allocation of funds from a PILOT agreement with Nine Mile Creek LP. In 2000, the parties entered into an agreement regarding the computation and allocation of the annual PILOT payments made under the PILOT Agreement covering the years 1999 through 2024 and the parties desire to extend the allocation of annual PILOT payments through the year 2040 pursuant to the same computation used in the 2000 Allocation Agreement.

Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion on the matter. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted aye and the motion carried.

TOWN OF MARCELLUS WASTEWATER AGREEMENT

EXTENSION:

Trustee Curtin made a motion to approve a 30-day extension to the Intermunicipal agreement between the Village and Town regarding Wastewater services. The current agreement expires on 12/31/24 and this extension will allow the parties to continue to

negotiate the terms of renewal and avoid an interruption in service. The motion was seconded by Trustee Manahan. Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion on the matter. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted aye and the motion carried.

F.J. POMPO ACCOUNTING SUPPORT

CONTRACT:

Trustee Manahan made a motion to enter into an agreement with FJ Pompo & Co. for accounting support and oversight from December 15, 2024 through May 31, 2025 to assist the Village Treasurer with various duties and responsibilities. The agreement includes services such as a high-level review of accounting transactions each month, assistance in preparation of and review of all bank account reconciliations and reconciling items, monitoring budget versus actual results monthly, proposal of budget modifications monthly to ensure balances are not overspent, preparation and filing of the AFR for fiscal year ending 5/31/25, and preparation of the annual budget with input and assistance from Village Officials. Due to the recent personnel change in the office of the Village Treasurer, the Board feels that this financial consulting is necessary to ensure the fiscal integrity of the Village while the recently appointed Treasurer acclimates to her position. The motion was seconded by Trustee Curtin. Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion on the matter. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted aye and the motion carried.

HEALTH INSURANCE

CONTRACTS: Trustee Curtin stated that all employees elected to stay with Excellus Blue Cross/Blue Shield, and the majority of employees have elected to enroll in the Platinum plan offered. The cost for all Excellus plans has risen this year. Overall, the cost to the Village has increased about 9% for major medical and 3% for dental beginning January 2025. Trustee Curtin made a motion to authorize the Mayor to sign the Health Insurance Contracts with Excellus Blue Cross/Blue Shield for 2025. The Village will cover 90% of the cost of a fulltime employee's benefits, while the employee will pay 10% of said cost. Part time employees with 30 years of continuous service will pay 25% of the cost. Copies of the new contracts and coverage are available for inspection in the Village Office. The motion was seconded by Trustee Manahan. Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion on the matter. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted aye and the motion carried.

EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE

OPT-OUT:

Trustee Manahan made a motion to approve a health insurance opt-out for full time Village employees who are covered under another health care program. This opt-out, the details of which are on file in the Village Office, would grant a buy-out incentive for the employee who chooses to opt-out, and would also provide a financial benefit for the Village, whose annual premium on behalf of the employee, would be eliminated. The motion was seconded by Trustee Curtin. Mayor Clark asked if there was any discussion on the matter. Hearing none, Mayor Clark called for a vote. All board members voted age and the motion carried.

SET PUBLIC HEARING - LOCAL LAW #1

OF 2025:

Trustee Curtin made a motion to introduce Local Law #1 of 2025 which will govern the design forms and character desired in the Village Center and codify the design requirements to aid in the protection of the Village's "small town" character, and to set a public hearing for Monday, January 27, 2025 at 7:00 pm on the matter.
